	At a minimum, the Offeror shall provide the following (in the case of joint ventures, the information detailed below shall be disclosed for all entities):
	1. Lead Contractor's numeric Experience Modification Rating, the rating year and the name of the Insurance Company issuing the rating for each of the past six (6) years;
	2. List of all OSHA citations, the date of each occurrence and their dispositions for the past ten (10) years, against the Prime Contractor and major Subcontractors;
	3. Lead contractor's OSHA 300A Summary Form for year 2005 to present and Recordable Incidence Rates (RIR) and Lost Time Incidence Rates (LTIR) for each of the past five (5) years;
	4. All relevant railroad safety training and certifications;
	5. Prime Contractor's company safety plan.
